"If you know your enemy and yourself, you will never lose in a hundred battles." Probably many of you <u>have heard</u> this phrase. These famous words <u>come from</u> "The <u>Art</u> of War" by Sun Tzu, an <u>ancient</u> Chinese military text written 2,500 years ago. <u>It basically teaches us how to</u> be successful in war, <u>but it is still</u> very useful today. Many things <u>in our lives</u> are like <u>battles</u>, such as examinations, playing sports, <u>romantic</u> relationships, and <u>job</u> hunting. His teachings are based <u>on his</u> deep understanding <u>of</u> human nature. So <u>even though it was written</u> a long time ago, <u>its</u> <u>lessons</u> are quite valuable today. What is the key to <u>success in</u> battles?

Sun Tzu says, "to win a hundred battles is not the best." You may be <u>surprised at</u> this <u>saying</u>. Winning all the battles you fight <u>seems</u> great, <u>but he disagrees</u>. Sun Tzu <u>continues</u> "to <u>break</u> the enemy <u>without fighting</u> is the best way." Fighting is nothing more than <u>means to an end</u>, and <u>it costs lives</u> and <u>resources</u>. If you can break the <u>will of</u> the enemy without war, you should not fight. We often <u>make</u> the means <u>an end in itself</u>. For example, taking notes is just a means of <u>learning</u>, but we often <u>focus only on</u> making the notebook beautiful. We should ask ourselves whether <u>it helps us</u> understand and remember the lesson. Sun Tzu's words always <u>remind us of</u> the <u>following important</u> questions. "What is the final purpose?" "Does this <u>serve as</u> a means to achieve the <u>goal</u>?" "<u>Is there another</u> better way?"

Usually, the <u>result of</u> a battle is already decided <u>before it</u> starts because great military leaders only fight <u>when they</u> have the <u>necessary</u> conditions to win. Sun Tzu wrote, "Successful leaders <u>win first</u>, <u>and then</u> go to war. Unsuccessful leaders go to war <u>first</u>, <u>and then seek</u> to win." The outcome is mostly decided <u>during</u> the <u>preparation phase</u>, <u>not on the actual</u> battlefield. Great leaders collect all the information necessary to know their enemy and <u>themselves</u>. They <u>prepare</u> enough soldiers, <u>weapons</u>, and food. They use spies and <u>diplomats</u> to decrease the <u>power</u> of the enemy. They carefully choose the <u>location</u> of the battlefield. Successful leaders do everything they can <u>before</u> the fighting begins. They win the actual battle all too <u>easily</u> because they fight the enemy that is <u>just about to</u> lose.
