What are the <u>benefits</u> of learning another language? You may think <u>that the</u> answer is <u>simple</u>; we can communicate <u>with people from different</u> backgrounds <u>who</u> speak other native languages <u>than our own</u>. This is <u>true</u>, but today, we have to <u>think about this again</u>. <u>Due to the rapid development of machine translation and generative AI in recent years</u>, computers can translate <u>better than</u> most humans. The value of language <u>skills themselves</u> may <u>have decreased</u>. However, learning <u>and</u> speaking <u>different languages will still remain</u> valuable. Learning <u>foreign languages makes us</u> more creative, <u>flexible</u>, and <u>respectful</u> to other <u>cultures</u>. <u>What are</u> the values of learning another language?

Learning another language makes us more <u>creative</u>. Many studies have <u>shown</u> that bilinguals <u>score</u> higher <u>on</u> creativity <u>tasks</u> <u>than</u> monolinguals. <u>When a</u> bilingual person <u>hears</u> a <u>certain</u> word, a <u>larger part of their</u> brain becomes active <u>than the</u> monolingual brain. For example, when Japanese speakers hear the word "<u>post</u>" in Japanese, they <u>associate it with similar words and related ideas</u> in Japanese, such as "<u>poster</u>", "<u>letter</u>" and "red." <u>But when bilinguals in Japanese and English hear the word, they also <u>associate it with related words in English</u>, including "<u>posture</u>", "post-<u>war</u>", and "social <u>media</u>". A <u>wider part of the brain is active, so it is easier to <u>come up with a variety of ideas</u>.</u></u>

When you learn a <u>foreign language</u>, we often face such differences and have to <u>try hard to</u> understand the cultural <u>backgrounds</u>. <u>Even within</u> the same culture, people have different <u>ways of thinking</u>. So all of us <u>need to learn how to</u> understand, <u>accept</u>, and <u>get along well with</u> people <u>with</u> different values. Learning another language <u>helps us to</u> respect and understand various ideas and cultures.
